We are establishing a current list of **emergency only** contact phone numbers. Please call the Village Office to provide at least one emergency number for your household.

- No events where large groups will assemble.
- Private campgrounds that choose to remain open should do so under the following practices:
- + common buildings should be closed and recreational activities including, but not limited to: playgrounds, swimming pools, water spray parks, boat rentals, train/tractor rides, hay rides, mini-golf, games rooms, arcades, go-karts, gym facilities and group sports/courts and any rental equipment are prohibited.
- + a strong employee illness policy.
- + social gatherings such as group bonfires, potlucks, happy hour, etc. are prohibited.
- + provide information to campers about social distancing/post signage with rules and COVID precautions.
- + self-contained camping only, meaning water supply, holding tanks and personal washroom facilities on board RV & trailers.

THE NEW LAND USE BYLAW #192-2019 ~ SOME HIGHLIGHTS

What is a permitted use vs a discretionary use?

Permitted use means the use of land or building(s) which is permitted in a district for which a development permit <u>shall be issued</u>, following receipt by the Development Officer of a completed application with appropriate details and fees.

Discretionary use means the use of land or building(s) provided for in the Land Use Bylaw for which a development permit <u>may be issued</u>, following receipt by the Development Officer of a completed application with appropriate details and fees.
