VILLAGE COUNCIL MEETING

The regular Village Council meeting was held on Thursday May, 14, 2020 at the Glenwood Community Hall. Bylaw #245-2020 was passed, increasing irrigation fees (to help cover the costs of increased maintenance on the system). Also, the By-election was scheduled for Tuesday, July 21, 2020. Anyone interested in running for the position of Councillor for the village, please stop into the village office to pick up a nomination package. Nomination paperwork must be turned into the village office on Tuesday, June 2 from 10 – 11 AM or June 9 from 3-4 PM. Draft minutes of the meeting can be found on www.glenwood.ca.

PROPERTY ASSESSMENT NOTICES

Property assessment notices were mailed out last week. If you haven't received yours yet, just let us know at the Village Office, and you can come pick one up. The associated Tax Notices will be in the mail in late June. The tax payment date has been extended this year to September 30, 2020, due to COVID19 and the Alberta government non-residential education tax deferral.

THE NEW LAND USE BYLAW #192-2019 ~ SOME HIGHLIGHTS

DEVELOPMENT PERMIT – WHEN REQUIRED

- Except as otherwise provided for in Schedule 4 (Development Not Requiring a Permit), all development shall be required to obtain a development permit.
- In addition to meeting the requirements of this bylaw, it is the responsibility of the applicant to ascertain, obtain and comply with all other approvals and licenses that may be required by other federal, provincial or municipal regulatory departments or agencies.

DEVELOPMENT PERMIT APPLICATION

- An application for a development permit shall be made to the Development Officer by submitting:
 - a completed development permit application, signed by the registered owner or authorized by the owner pursuant to subsection 26.2;
 - the prescribed fee, as set by Council in the Village of Glenwood Rates, Fees and Charges Bylaw;
 - 3. a description of the existing and proposed use of the land, building(s) and/or structures and whether it is a new

public and private events. Village Council Meetings will be held there on regularly scheduled dates and times, as it is large enough to facilitate the required social distancing requirements. We also require all attendees to wear a mask, but if you are showing any symptoms, please do not attend at all. The next Village **Council meeting is** scheduled for Thursday, June 11, at 7:00 PM.

- development, an alteration/addition, relocation or change of use and whether the use is temporary in nature;
- 4. a site plan acceptable to the Development Officer indicating:
 - a) the location of all existing and proposed buildings and structures and registered easements or rights-of-way, dimensioned to property lines and drawn to a satisfactory scale;
 - existing and proposed parking and loading areas, driveways, abutting streets, avenues and lanes, and surface drainage patterns;
 - c) where applicable, the location of existing wells, septic tanks, disposal fields, culverts and crossings;
 - d) any additional information as may be stipulated in the standards of development;
 - e) any such other information as may be required by the Development Officer or Municipal Planning Commission to evaluate an application including but not limited to: conceptual design schemes, landscaping plans, building plans, drainage plans, servicing and infrastructure plans, soil analysis, geotechnical reports and/or other reports regarding site suitability, Real Property Report, or a surveyor's sketch.

Born 1935, Passed away May 14, 2020 Age 84

HISTORY OF THE GLENWOOD DISTRICT (PART 1 OF A SERIES) – WRITTEN BY DORA LAW,

In the year 1880, the "Cochrane Ranch Company" was organized in Eastern Canada with Senator Cochrane of Quebec as president. The company owned several farms and ranches including the Pure Bred Cattle Farm in Quebec. From this farm came the basic herd for a ranch in South Western Alberta. This ranch, which has long been known as "The Cochrane Ranch", was the first of its kind in Southern Alberta and comprised 66,500 acres situated about 20 miles east of the Rocky Mountains and about 25 miles north of the US/Canadian border.

In the year 1906, the manager of this farm, a man named Dunlap, froze to death on the Macleod Trail. Senator Cochrane passed away in the East and a man named Colonel Mullin was made manager.

There had been a large stone house built near the east end of the Ranch and a house and necessary buildings for the cowboys and ranch hands about $\frac{1}{2}$ mile away. This cowboy's home still stands and has always been known as "The Blue House" because of its color at the time.

About 1906 Latter-day Saints and other families were beginning to settle the surrounding land, taking up homesteads mostly. Some of these

family names were Carter, Woodruff, Shipley, Newby, Billingsley, Beaves, Hovis, Whipple, Bester, Cotton and others.

Edward J Wood, who was then president of the Alberta Stake, suggested to the General Authorities of the Church the idea of purchasing the Cochrane Ranch and reselling it to LDS families who wished to make their home in Canada. President Wood made a trip to Quebec to complete the sale with Colonel Mullin of the Cochrane Ranch Company. The price was \$399,000 or \$6 per acre with \$99,000 cash, the balance to be paid at \$60,000 per year with no interest.

The Ranch Co. was given 3 years to dispose of their cattle in return for the "no interest" terms of the sale. These 'wild' cattle roamed the open prairie and are still the subject of many fireside tales of our few remaining pioneers. There were no fences, the grass grew stirrup high to the cowmen, very thick, and all this helped to give the whole country the appearance of the Wild and Wooly West.

The church sent Seymour B. Smith, Civil Engineer, with Golden L. Woolf, D. Osborn Wight, Abner Bohne and Oliver Goble, as rod men to survey the land for farms, to determine the prospect of irrigation and to lay out plans for two townsites. The Village of Glenwood was named for Glen, the oldest son of President E.J. Wood.

The land was still known as the 'Cochrane Ranch'. Later it was Cochrane Municipality and is now part of the Cardston M.D. (to be continued)
