My name is Wayne Smith and I have decided to run for Glenwood Village Council.

For those who do not know me, I moved here with my parents in 1948 and spent my childhood and youth here and graduated from Glenwood High School in 1961. I left for university, a mission, marriage, a bachelor's degree from BYU and a Master's Degree from the University of Maine. I taught school in Maine, Utah, Washington State, and New Zealand.

In 1976 we moved back to Glenwood with our 5 children. Three more were born here, so we raised our 8 children here in Glenwood. I taught school in Cardston for 24 years. When we moved back to Glenwood in 1976 not much had changed from when I left in 1961.

While serving on council for 14 years, I was able to work with some great men and women on council and in administration. We were able to hire Perry Hunsperger (that was significant and he attended all our council meetings). We were able to put in a sewer system, gravity water system, begin a library and build a New Library/Village Office Building, set up the Twin River's Fire Department with a new fire hall and village shop building, build a new ball diamond and skating rink, establish Spring Glen Park and bring in oiled roads.

Things are different today because we have all of these things. I feel we do not need to build more things, but we need to maintain what we have. When I saw the Village build a spray park and BMX Track without public input, I was very upset. I realized that communication between the public and administration and council was almost non-existent. There was a great deal of criticism and discontent.

My main goal in running for office is to make sure that the public are informed about everything and that we all work together as a team: citizens, council, Administration, and foreman. The Glenwood Gleanings has been resurrected and is now a municipal publication that goes into all mail boxes. I would hope that Council, Administration, and the citizens will support this publication and use it to keep informed. There are many things that Council and Administration can do to keep the public informed. It can be used to clear up rumors and gossip.

A good example would be to inform the public about the real cost of operating the Ice Cream Parlour. I have heard that it made money last year and I have heard that it cost the tax payers thousands of dollars. I would like to know. What is going on with the Chief Mountain Solid Waste? I heard that they are changing their name. Why? We need to be informed. What else has changed or is going to change? When is the Spring Glen Park opening? When is it free to the residents of Glenwood, Hill Spring, and the Cardston County residents living between the rivers to camp? Who do I contact to make a booking? What is being done on the roads this year? Did you know that the cost of Police Services has increased for our Village this year by about \$5,875? Can we begin a letter writing campaign to express our concerns. I would like to see the AGM (Annual General Meeting) come back where the citizens can go and find out from Council what has been done this last year and what is proposed. I would like to see that there is a place where the public can be involved in all projects. It is not right for workers to show up outside our door and start tearing up the boulevard without ever informing the public what was going on and not having had any opportunity for input. We need a way to invite public input.

Another concern I have is the events that have caused our neighbors in the County to feel ostracized and have bad feelings towards the Village. We have always worked closely with the County members, and Hill Spring, and they have always willingly served on many of our committees. A small community like Glenwood must work

VILLAGE COUNCIL MEETING

The regular Village Council meeting was held on Thursday June, 11, 2020 at the Glenwood Community Hall. The Mill Rate Budget & 2020 Tax Bylaw was passed. Also passed was the updated Municipal Borrowing Bylaw. The CAO resignation was accepted, the final date dependent upon hiring and training of replacement CAO.

HISTORY OF THE GLENWOOD DISTRICT (PART 2 OF A SERIES) – WRITTEN BY DORA LAW,

Settlers began coming from far and near to settle on the land. The first house built on the surveyed Village site was built by Sam Buck and still stands. Bertha Buck, widow of Sam Buck tells of moving into Glenwood in May 1908 from Beazer in a snow storm.

There were no bridges and the trail from Cardston to Glenwood wound across the open prairie in the most general direction of least resistance.

The Belly River, one mile south of Glenwood, separated the Cochrane Ranch from the Blood Indian Reservation. Both the unbridged river and the Indian Reservation had to be crossed to get to Cardston and this was always a source of concern to the traveller and those left at home.

Cardston was the main source of supply for groceries, mail and contact with the outside world. The Indian wars were over by this time, but the Indians were not all friendly. They were always curious and often called on the settlers for food or help.

The Belly River has always been the main source of water supply for the district. At first, the water was hauled in barrels loaded either in wagons or on stoneboats and the cattle and horses were driven to the river at least once a day. Later, the people built cisterns for supply, but still hauled the water from the river in tanks with horses or trucks.

In December 1908, Bishop V.I. Stewart of Mountain View received a call from the church to go to the Glenwood area to help pioneer and

build up the community. He and his son, Lester, lived in a tent the first summer. In 1909, he built the house now occupied by Earl Archibald.

Many of the settlers had come to Glenwood and "camped" to farm their land during the summer and had returned to Cardston for the winter months. But in the spring of 1909, many permanent homes were begun and the little place called Glenwood was started. Large homes were built by Edward and Edwin Leavitt, James Layton and Vincent I. Stewart. Many other large and comfortable homes were erected in the years that followed.

On July 25, 1909, a branch of the Cardston Ward was organized in the James Billingsley home. This was a log house which stood on the same corner where Byron Smith now lives. This branch was changed to the Glenwood Ward in September 12, 1909, or less than 2 months later.

There were 23 families present at the first meeting. Names of families present: James Billingsley, V.I. Stewart, Nels Nielson, Edward Leavitt, Edwin Leavitt, Edward Newby, Sam Buck, R.V. Carter, Ernest Law, J.S. Farrell, Albert Beaves, E. Bigelow, Jerry Woodruff, Wilford Woodruff, Dave Woodruff, Arthur Vicery, Elizabeth Webb, Alfred Sillito, Orrin Shipley, Orson Daines, Sister Sorenson, Alex Leishman and Dwight Bliss.

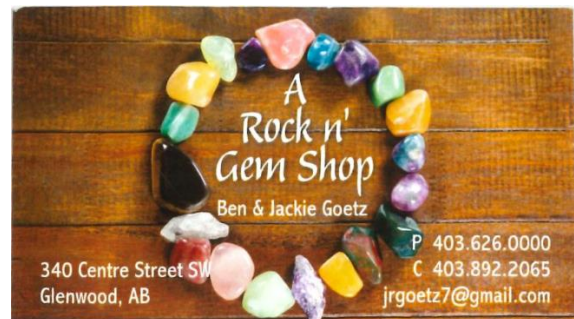
