# Village Office News

#### Village Council General Election Nomination Info

The nomination period for the 2021 general election begins on January 1, 2021 and runs until 12:00 noon on nomination day: Monday, September 20, 2021. Please pick up nomination packages at the Village Office.

Candidate Eligibility:

1. A person may be nominated in any election under the Local Authorities Election Act (LAEA) if the person:

- is eligible to vote in the election;
- has resided in the municipality for 6 consecutive months immediately preceding nomination day; and
- is not otherwise ineligible.

2. A person is ineligible to be nominated as a candidate in any election under the LAEA if:

- the person is the auditor of the local jurisdiction;
- the person is an employee of the local jurisdiction for which the election is to be held unless the person has taken a leave of absence;
- the person is indebted to the municipality for taxes in default exceeding \$50 (excluding indebtedness on current taxes, and indebtedness for arrears of taxes for which the person has entered into a consolidation agreement with the municipality);
- the person is indebted to the local jurisdiction for any debt exceeding \$500 and is in default for more than 90 days; and
- the person has, within the previous 10 years, been convicted of an offence under the LAEA, the Election Act, the Election Finances and Contributions Disclosure Act, or the Canada Elections Act (Canada).
- 3. Candidates who seek nomination for office must complete Form 4 -Nomination Paper and Candidate's Acceptance (available on <u>alberta.ca</u>). Generally, nominations must be signed by a minimum of five electors. These electors must be residents of the local jurisdiction on the date they signed the form, and must be eligible to vote in the election.

4. In addition to the Nomination Form and Candidate's Acceptance (Form 4), the candidate must also file Form 5 - Candidate Information (available on <u>albera.ca</u>).

5. Candidates can begin to file nomination papers with the returning officer on January 1 in the year of a general election.

Or just drop a hand-written note in the mailbox beside the door of the village office – just remember to add your name and phone number should we have any questions regarding the submission. Business card sized ads can be purchased for \$12 per year and double size for \$24 per year at the Village Office.

#### Pecuniary Interest

Alberta's municipal councillors have a strong record of public service to their communities. As a public servant, you are responsible for upholding the public interest ahead of any private interests you may have. The Municipal Government Act (MGA) describes pecuniary interest and sets out the procedures you must follow if a matter in which you have a pecuniary interest comes up at a council meeting or a committee of council meeting. These rules are designed to protect the public interest while ensuring that your ability to work is not adversely affected by your election to council. In order that the public interest is served and seen to be served, it is important that you be open and honest about dealing with the municipality. Be fair to yourself, your electors and your municipality by keeping your private interests in harmony with the public interest.

#### Instalment Plan to Pay Property Taxes on a Monthly Basis

Village of Glenwood Bylaw #176-94 (Tax Instalment Plan) allows a resident to pay their taxes by monthly instalments (January - December). Even though the annual taxes are not due to be paid until July 31st of each year, you could have a good portion of that tax bill already paid by the time you receive it. To be eligible to participate in this program, your 2020 taxes must be paid in full prior to December 31, 2020. To take advantage of this opportunity, just visit the village office to complete the paperwork before January 15. A resident who has signed up for monthly instalments will not be charged late fees or penalties on the unpaid current taxes during the current year (2021 taxes must be paid in full during 2021).

#### 2021 Utility Payment Incentive

All utility accounts that are paid in full before February 28, 2021, will receive the December utility charges free.

## 13 Ways to Kill Your Community:

(Excerpts from a book of the same name, written by Doug Griffiths & Kelly Clemmer, 2010)

- + <u>Don't Have Quality Water</u> "...the poorest 20 percent of the world's population spends more than 10 percent of their income on water." "I fully believe that the next great war will be fought over oil, but the last great war of humankind will be fought over water. If you look at it this way, how can anyone possibly say that the cost of water is too much?"
- \* <u>Don't Attract Business</u> "With a little bit of information on what people leave town for, there may be some local resident who just needs a little push to open that business or provide that service."

- \* <u>Ignore Your Youth</u> "Youth men and women approximately 35 and younger are typically the most energetic individuals within your community, and are full of creative, innovative ideas not yet prejudiced by bad experiences and fruitless pursuits. Within youth lies the hope that anything is still possible if we can just dream it, and the energy and passion to pursue those dreams until their realization."
- \* <u>Deceive Yourself About Your Real Needs or Values</u> "...every single community also has something that gives it a competitive advantage over other places down the road and around the world. Each community has something unique and wonderful that it offers it inhabitants or those people wouldn't choose to live there."
- Shop Elsewhere "While money, or more money, is rarely the solution to solving any problem, and is never the first step in addressing that problem, it can be a part of creating problems. I am not talking here about the apparent lack of funds that communities have to address the needs of their citizens, but about the individual choices citizens make in how they spend money and the consequences those choices have on their fellow community members."
- <u>Don't Paint</u> "Of course, painting isn't the only factor included in this concept it encompasses anything that may beautify your community such as sweeping, cleaning, planting flowers, mowing grass, picking up garbage and so on."
- \* <u>Don't Cooperate</u> "From our first day in kindergarten, we have all been taught the importance of learning how to cooperate with each other. Almost everything takes cooperation to be successful."
- \* <u>Live in the Past</u> "...killing your community is all about attitude. The beginning and end of every community is its people and the collective attitude they have about how they define success and whether or not they want to achieve it."
- \* <u>Ignore Your Seniors</u> "In many cultures around the world, seniors are revered for the wisdom and experience they hold. Most of us, however, tend to view our seniors as just easy-going and cordial folks. They are rarely viewed as a factor when it comes to the future. Don't be fooled."
- <u>Reject Everything New</u> "The implicit nature in a human is to strive and work to achieve consistency because in consistency there is security. As we age, this tendency increases and we become more willing to trade risk and adventure for security and consistency. We tend to prefer the devil we know over the one we don't."
- \* <u>Ignore Outsiders</u> "Outsiders have many common traits, but they are not one distinct group. Outsiders are those who do not typically identify with your community's shared general sense of who it is. Outsiders can be from a different, distinct cultural group, or speak a different language, have a different history, live a different lifestyle and eat different food, or anything else that makes them different from the average member of your community. The reason that these outsiders are dangerous and can cause your community to experience success all comes down to the simple fact that they chose your community to live in."
- \* <u>Become Complacent</u> "We can't always be vigilant, but when we relax for too long, we can lose focus enough that we forget how to regain it. Many people who become complacent still talk a tough game and still give the impression that they are fully determined to attain their goal. Inside, however, they are often suffering from laziness, burnout, or overconfidence, but don't really how their performance has been affected.
- \* <u>Don't Take Responsibility</u> "The particular effectiveness of the "avoiding responsibility" technique is that it is contagious."
