Father's Day was inaugurated in the United States in the early 20th century to complement Mother's Day in celebrating fathers, fathering, and fatherhood.

Father's Day was founded in Spokane, Washington at the YMCA in 1910 by Sonora Smart Dodd, who was born in Arkansas. Its first celebration was in the Spokane YMCA on June 19, 1910. Her father, the Civil War veteran William Jackson Smart, was a single parent who raised his six children there. After hearing a sermon about Anna Jarvis's Mother's Day at Central Methodist Episcopal Church in 1909, she told her pastor that fathers should have a similar holiday honouring them. Although she initially suggested June 5, her father's birthday, the pastors of the Spokane Ministerial Alliance did not have enough time to prepare their sermons, and the celebration was deferred to the third Sunday of June.

It did not have much success initially. In the 1920s, Dodd stopped promoting the celebration because she was studying in the Art Institute of Chicago, and it faded into relative obscurity, even in Spokane. In the 1930s Dodd returned to Spokane and started promoting the celebration again, raising awareness at a national level. She had the help of those trade groups that would benefit most from the holiday, for example the manufacturers of ties, tobacco pipes, and any traditional present to fathers. Since 1938 she had the help of the Father's Day Council, founded by the New York Associated Men's Wear Retailers to consolidate and systematize the commercial promotion. Americans resisted the holiday during a few decades, perceiving it as just an attempt by merchants to replicate the commercial success of Mother's Day, and newspapers frequently featured cynical and sarcastic attacks and jokes. But the trade groups did not give up: they kept promoting it and even



incorporated the jokes into their adverts, and they eventually succeeded. By the mid-1980s the Father's Council wrote that "Father's Day has become a Second Christmas for all the men's giftoriented industries."

Robert (Bob) Downey Feb 07, 1938—March 8, 2021

It is with sadness that we announce his passing. This was a man who loved people, children and pets and was a natural entertainer.

Bob was born in North Bay Ontario. He spent a few years of his youth in a Catholic Boys school, where he excelled in several sports.

He joined the Air Force but was discharged when they found he was too young, but he re-enlisted as soon as he was of age. While in the Air Force he did a lot of boxing. While enlisted he met and married Jacqueline Porteous and when he was released they moved to her family home in Victoria, BC. After their first daughter was born, they moved to Whitehorse in the Yukon. They lived in

Whitehorse for about a year and Bob worked in a Sporting Good Store. But the winter was bitter cold and they travelled back to Victoria.

Bob joined Supply and Services Canada as a seaman in 1966 and travelled to the Artic on the iced breaker Sir John A MacDonald. Then he went on to the Canadian Services Rescue Cutters, serving on various boats for three years. His health dictated a break from this depressing work and he started a music store in Victoria. As well as selling instruments of all kinds, he had music teachers who taught piano and guitar, as well, Bob taught drumming.

Unfortunately, Bob and his wife were divorced and he sold the store and went back to sea. He took Marine Training in Vancouver and advanced from Seaman to Ocean Navigator I. While taking this training he worked on ocean/marine research ships, BC Ferries inland ferries and ended his marine career in 1995 as Captain of a Voss Schneider tug at Dockyard in Victoria.

Of special note is the fact that Bob's lifelong passion and love was drumming. He started drumming on his mothers' pots and pans at the age of five and got his first set of drums at the age of eleven and the rest is history. As a young man in Ontario, he travelled to the US with a buddy to play and sing and he was invited to play with some of the big bands in the Southern States. He studied music, taught music, had his own band in Victoria where he played and sang in several night clubs. He belonged to the Masonic Lodge and played with the Shriners Band. He also was the band leader for the Chinatown Lions Band and In 2007 he was inducted into the Victoria Music Hall of Fame, being honored as 'most Influential Musician from 1956-1959 '.

He met Myrna Young in 1972 and joined her and her family in her home in Victoria in 1983. In 1991 they moved up-island to an acreage in the Cobble Hill area, where they remained until moving to Glenwood in 2009. Bob enjoyed playing at the afternoon barbershop jams in Cardston, occasionally at Spring Glen Park at Seniors picnics and some jam sessions at the Barn Dance.

Bob and Myrna travelled to the Yukon almost every year after Myrna's daughter moved to Haines Junction. His loved watching the grizzlies feed on berries in the fall, so to honor this memory and his wishes, his ashes will be scattered in that area in the Yukon.

Bob is survived by two daughters, Michele in Victoria and Kim and her husband in Campbell River, four grand children and great grand children. He was predeceased by his Mother and Father and a younger sister.


