FRANCHISE FEE INCREASE NOTICE

Please be advised that the Village of Glenwood is proposing to increase the local access fee, which is charged to FortisAlberta Inc. (FortisAlberta) for use of municipal lands for its power lines effective **April 1, 2022.**

The fee is recovered by FortisAlberta from its customers as the local municipal access fee on electric billings of all customers that receive electric service in the Village. This local access fee will be increased from \$0.00 (0%) to \$3.56 (5%) of the delivery charge of FortisAlberta, excluding energy related riders. This calculation is based on 640 kWh consumption in 30 days.

Roberta taught herself to sew and spent many late nights on her trusty Bernina finishing holiday outfits, or dance costumes. Her grandchildren were delighted to receive her handmade quilts.

Anyone who knew Roberta loved receiving her homemade baking or Christmas chocolates. The candy and nut bowls kept by the front door were a favourite of grandchildren. Sharing food and hosting family and friends were Roberta's language of love.

Through the years Roberta served faithfully in many church positions, and more importantly looked for opportunities to quietly serve others. When she committed to do something, she went above and beyond which has been a model for her posterity.

In 1995 Roberta and Byron served a mission for The Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-Day Saints in New Brunswick and Nova Scotia. They also served in the Cardston Alberta Temple for many years.

If you asked Roberta to describe herself, she would tell you that she was a simple woman who tried to raise a good family. However, if you asked her family, they would use words like selfless, thoughtful, faith filled, determined, courageous, industrious, a loyal friend, creative, hard-working and loving. An elect lady!

Roberta was preceded in death by her husband Byron to whom she was married for 72 years. Their posterity includes their children: Craig (Colleen), Wendy (Dave-deceased), Barbara (Robert), Aileen (John), Kevin (Kelly- deceased), Danny (Wanda), Drew (Ross), Julie (Marc), thirty-five grandchildren, seventy-three great grandchildren, and three great-great grandchildren.






