Hello Villagers,

I am grateful for the opportunity to serve as a Councillor these last six months and have enjoyed the camaraderie that I have felt with other council members. I can attest that each council member, along with our hard-working CAO, are interested in the village's success and are working to that end.

I want to share a message of hope and what it means to be a neighbour. I have learned during the last five years that the saying "sometimes the best thing about living in a small town is that everyone knows everything about you, and also that sometimes the worst thing about living in a small town is that everyone knows everything about you". We take the negative with the positive and have the option of what we want to focus on each day.

As our preferred outcome, I propose that we conceptualize the concept of being a good neighbour. So, what does it mean to be a good neighbour? I am impressed with the many amazing neighbour's offering service and selfless kindness in Glenwood. Do we not all need help with something sometimes? We may need some kind words or just someone who will listen without judgement. We can be one of these types of neighbours - acting without prejudice and without reservation. I truly believe once we understand our purpose and potential to do good, any unwarranted fearfulness or thoughts of unneighborliness will dissipate.

The great thing is that we get to decide each day how we treat one another and if we ought to make life easier for our neighbour as opposed to being the cause of stress and anxiety for others. Overall, I have felt a neighbourly ethos that I am trying to emulate.

To this point, let me draw your attention to the 2019 movie, A Beautiful Day in the Neighbourhood. This movie is based on the true story of a real-life friendship between children's television character Fred Rogers and journalist Tom Junod. The film depicts the tale on how Mr. Rogers inspired Tom to get his life back on track through genuine care, acceptance and commitment. Although I know there was only one Mr. Rogers, I had a cathartic experience watching this film that inspired me to want to be a better me.

To further explain this overall concept, let us consider a leap in quantum health that was displayed by a team of German researchers at the University of Kassel in a 1997 case study. They were able to show that the chest area of a normal person emits only 20 photons of light per second, whereas those individuals who meditate on their heart centre and send love and light to others, emits an amazing 100,000 photons of light per second. That is 5000 times more than the average human being. - 3. Main Street Revitalization Project banners & flower pots



# **Prohibited Debris: Before You Burn...Learn!**

### **Burning Basics**

While burning may be the simplest way to clean up a site, you may be breaking the law.

Open burning, in a barrel or not, can release pollutants, reduce visibility, create unpleasant odors and cause toxic contamination.

With this in mind, burning can still be an effective way to clean some of the debris from your yard, farm or work site. However, you should keep in mind that under the *Environmental Protection and Enhancement Act*, burning certain materials is illegal.

### What You Can Burn

#### Burnable debris includes:

- Brush and fallen trees
- Used power and telephone poles that do not contain preservatives
- Wood or wood products not containing preservatives
- Solid waste from tree harvesting
- Straw, stubble, grass, weeds, leaves and tree prunings
- Solid waste from post and pole operations that does not contain wood preservatives

#### What You Can't Burn Prohibited debris includes:

- Animal manure
- Pathological waste (waste from human health centres)
- Wood or wood products containing wood preservatives
- Waste materials from construction sites
- Rubber, including tires
- Plastic, including baler twine
- Oil
- Containers that held pesticides, or any other chemicals
- Plastic or rubber-coated materials, including copper wire

#### **Remember to Recycle**

- Many items that you may consider burning, can be recycled
- Plastic, paper, cardboard and metal materials, used oil, tires and beverage containers along with many other items are recycled in Alberta. Call the Recycle Info Line at 1-800-463-8320 for local information
- It's often more effective to chip and compost yard waste. Composting reduces household waste by up to 30 per cent.

#### When do you need a permit to burn? A permit is needed to burn:

- Prohibited debris anywhere in Alberta
- Burnable debris in restricted areas
- Contact your local fire department to learn more about restrictions and requirements
- Fire season starts March 1 in Alberta and runs to at least October 31, though it can be extended. During the fire season all burning activities in Alberta's Forest Protection Area, excluding campfires, will require a fire permit. Fire permits are free and can be obtained by contacting your local Alberta Environment and Parks office. Phone tollfree 310-0000 to locate your nearest office or call the department's Information Centre for assistance.

### Where You Can't Burn

#### Prohibited areas include:

- Unauthorized burning is prohibited in all landfills
- Burning is restricted in Calgary, Edmonton and many other rural and urban municipalities
- Burning in the Forest Protection Area requires a permit. To examine a map of the forest protection area and its constituent fire control zones go to this webpage:

- During fire season, it's possible fire bans will be in place during times of increasing fire hazard. To find out where current fire bans are located, go to this webpage:

#### Be Sure

Different laws regulate where you may burn, and some require you have a permit even for burnable debris. Always contact your local municipality prior to striking a match. Additional brochures on fire bans and wildfire prevention are available through the Information Centre.

#### What is the Aged Cheese Country Club?

It is an organization of people from the Village of Glenwood, the Hartley area and surrounding rural area. We meet together to share a meal and socializing about 9 months of the year. Sometimes we are entertained and sometimes we play games and sometimes we get together for other outings. Our members (at least one spouse) are 55 or older.

#### What is our purpose?

Our purpose is to socialize with our friends and neighbours and get to know them better. They are all people who have chosen to live here. Some of us grew up here and left only to further our education and then returned. Some came as a young bride, some of us returned after living in other parts of the world and others found a place to enjoy the beautiful scenery and a community that shares their values, etc.

#### What does our name represent?

Our name reminds us of part of our heritage – some members like it and some do not. The name may remind you of Ned Davidson or Dennis Prince or an employment opportunity for yourself or a member of your family or fresh cheese curds. Aged cheese is made from great quality cheese and thus the Aged Cheese Club reminds us of Great Quality People – because we have many in our area.

#### How are we supported?

We receive an annual grant from the Village of Glenwood. We also receive an annual grant from FCSS (including during the 2 years of COVID) This grant is based on our membership fees. We pay membership dues, which are \$10.00 per year and occasionally from other sources.

#### How does the Aged Cheese Club Function?

We have a president, vice president, treasurer, secretary and committees to make phone calls, set up tables and sometimes find entertainment. Every one pitches in to make the meal happen and to clean up. We usually have elections each February but COVID has forced a change to that. Most of our meals are pot luck. Recently we have had a couple of people prepare the main part of the meal and the club pays for that. The rest bring potluck salad or dessert. Sometimes we have gone out to supper and sometimes we have had the meal catered. Sometimes we have had an activity with the Hill Spring group.

We would love to have some new members join our club. We would love the opportunity to get to know members of our community better. If these are some of the values you have in your life, we invite you to come and join us. <u>Our next activity is April 25 at 6 p.m. The main dish will be provided</u> and everyone attending, please bring potluck salad, vegetables or dessert.


A **Bumblebee** will be buzzing around the library from April 19-21! Come down and see if you can find it hiding among the stacks. When you do find it, you will win a prize!


