Dear Village Residents,

Greetings once again from Village Council. We have been very busy with changes and appreciate the village's support. Steven Law has resigned, which has left a hole in our council that will be difficult to fill. He thought, to begin with, that he would only be gone for six weeks, but unforeseen circumstances kept cropping up which extending his time away from Glenwood. We were all hopeful that things could get resolved and he could continue with his educated and wise counsel but not so. Thanks so much for your service, Steven.

To update you on Council's agenda:

- 1. Starting on a by-election to replace Steven, which is a fairly long procedure.
- 2. Carrie is on leave and in accordance to the Municipal Government Act (MGA), we have an acting Chief Administrative Officer (CAO), Jeff Coffman, in place.
- 3. Milo Holthe and Diane Turner are working on the following grants in collaboration with the Twin Rivers Country Economic Development Society & the Village Recreation Board:
- The school district has granted us \$10,000 towards equipment for our Multi Sport Recreation Facility.
- A community priority fund grant from the Lethbridge Community Foundation for \$15,000.
- The Save Energy grant from Fortis for \$5,000 for LED lights around the skating rink.
- Fortis has approved upgrading the electrical transformers on Main Street in preparation for the Electrical Vehicle Charging Stations. The new stations may take three months before they can be installed.
- 4. On Thursday, June 9, Perry is reporting to counsel on our village's infrastructure. Please be patient with us as we navigate through expenses without Saputo's revenue.

Our council is very excited about all the economic growth within the community. We have had a number of new people purchase properties in the Village. Our downtown businesses are growing. Van Dan's Is continually adding new products, Tina's Café has fresh baked goods (oh those donuts). The Cactus Pit is expanding their menu, Pioneer Ice Cream Parlour is selling many new locally made products (flavoured cheese curds, smokies, sausage, sauces, handmade lollypops, etc). It has been suggested by some residents that council give an up-to-date accounting of the things that are happening in the village and the committees that we serve on. So here is some information from me.

I attended a 3-day conference in Calgary for the Chinook Foundation. It was very informative and I learned a lot. One of the things that they emphasized was the fact that the largest population we have, the Baby Boomers, are aging out. That sounds ominous, doesn't it? They pointed out that the "Boomers" are not going to be content to live in the housing style that their parents did. They are demanding better facilities, with better options. With that in mind, The Chinook Foundation is looking to the future and trying to decide what that means and how to bring it about.

I also serve on the Cemetery Committee. There was a cemetery clean-up scheduled for Saturday, June 4, but it has been postponed to a later date—to be announced.

The next committee that I serve on is the Municipal Planning Commission. It is the body that decides on exceptions to the rules in our Land Use Bylaw. We have had a couple of meetings since I have been elected. One of the projects brought to us is the road closure to allow for a new subdivision to proceed.

The last committee that I serve on, due to Councillor Steven Law's recent resignation, is Cardston County Emergency Services. This committee is near and dear to my heart, and I would like to give a huge shout out to past and present first responders for all they have done and continue to do to assist the residents of this village in keeping us safe and helping us in times of need. Our past Fire Chief, Doral Lybbert retired in October of last year. There was a get together to show our gratitude to him and to thank him for 40+ years of service. There have been many people who have helped build the fire department that we have today, but no one has done more than Doral. Thanks Doral for all that you have given, and thanks for continuing to serve. We have co-Fire Chiefs now. Dennis and Clinton Lybbert share this responsibility. It is no small task and we thank them for their diligence.

Thank you to all our residents for your support and assistance as we, on council, are learning to navigate the waters of governance. If you have any questions, comments or suggestions, please reach out to us. We are giving it our best effort, but we realize we have a lot to learn and a long way to go yet.




