Our MLA and MP reported at the Mayors'/Reeves' meeting in Taber on Friday, June 24. These are a few things that you might want to take note of:

1. Your utility bill will have a subsidy attached to it for about nine (9) months. That's the good news. The bad news is that there are already scammers looking to bilk you out of your hard earned money. There are sites that tell you to click on their button (disguised as Alberta web pages) to receive your rebate. There is NOTHING you need to do to receive your rebate. It is automatic

2. Passports are backlogged for more than 6 months. If your passport is going to expire this year and even next, you probably want to get on it right away to ensure that you will have the document you need at the time you need it.

3. The Alberta government is changing their EMS policy. In the past, they have commandeered our ambulances if the bigger municipalities have been short. They promise us that this will no longer be the case. The only time they will require out of town ambulances to be waylaid is if there is a life threatening emergency while they are in the area. George Porter, you would be the guy we look to, to verify the truthfulness of this statement.

4. The Alberta government is implementing an online method to renew your drivers' licenses, as well as some other government issued ID. Hopefully, this will make your life much easier.

5. The Old Man River Watershed is looking for volunteers to help plant trees and do other things to shore up banks and protect the rivers in our areas. If you're interested, please contact them directly.

Gone, but not Forgotten...



BYRON CRAIG SMITH, long time resident of Glenwood, Alberta, passed away peacefully in his sleep at the age of 75 years old, on Saturday June 18, 2022 after a valiant battle with brain cancer. Craig was a beloved husband, father, brother, and friend.

Craig is survived by his eternal companion, Colleen Smith; his 6 children Chad (Jen), Liz (Jeff), Carol (Joe), Demond, Angie, and Natasha; 7 siblings, 22 grand children, 3 great grand children and his many nieces and nephews. Craig is pre-deceased by his mother, Roberta Billingsley Smith, his father, Byron Smith and 2 children, David & Sariah Smith.

Craig grew up in typical Southern Alberta fashion, playing softball, basketball and baseball in his teenage years. Craig was grateful to serve a French speaking mission in Quebec, Canada, both for the amazing experience it was, as well as the opportunity to meet the woman of his dreams upon arriving home. He met the sister of his missionary companion at the airport. He married Colleen Marie Torrie on November 29, 1969, celebrating their 52nd Anniversary last year.

Craig grew up with the values and work ethic that came starting as a youth, throwing bales, working on the ranch with his father-in-law, and dairy farming with his own Father. He demonstrated the importance of education to his children by obtaining a bachelor's degree in animal science from BYU, and later returning to earn his MBA at the University of Alberta with 5 children. Craig provided for his family in a variety of ways, including managing for the Bank of Montreal in Leduc, AB and Viking, AB, various consulting roles including management and leadership training, Rural Diversification at the Lethbridge Community College, and Farm Debt Mediation as a Professional Agrologist. He rounded out his career as Assistant Manager at United Irrigation District (UID) in Glenwood for 7 years, where he was instrumental in writing a history book of the UID.

Craig loved to be outdoors working, helping with his children's home projects, or coaching his kids in sports. He was the master of the 5-minute power nap on the floor and tried his best to be a fisherman and occasional golfer.

Craig was a faithful and active member of The Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints. He diligently served in many capacities including (among others), Bishop, Branch president, member of the Stake Presidency, Primary teacher, Seminary teacher and Scout leader. Upon asking him if he was reading any good books he would most often reply, "Yes, the Book of Mormon". He absolutely loved the scriptures and loved to talk about the gospel. Craig's faith was manifest in both word and deed. He loved to share his testimony, love of the gospel, and the Saviour with his family. Craig didn't seek the limelight and very humbly loved to quietly serve, minister to, and help family and friends. He always invited the Spirit into every family dinner/gathering with his righteous words of wisdom/testimony before he asked a family member to say the prayer.

We would like to especially thank the wonderful staff and management at the Good Samaritan Society at Lee Crest for all the kind and compassionate care given to Craig in the last months of his life.

Craig's Funeral Service was held on Saturday, June 25th at The Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints, Glenwood, Alberta. Interment followed the funeral service in the Glenwood Cemetery.

There Are No Beans in Real Chili: Just Ask a Texan

In Texas, chili is all about the beef and chiles

Conjure a bowl of chili in your head. Does it have big chunks of tomatoes, little nuggets of ground beef, and lots of red beans? Then you're probably not from Texas. Because in Texas, you'll rarely (if ever) find a bowl of chili that contains beans.

There's a saying in Texas: "If you know beans about chili, you know chili ain't got no beans." In Texas, "chili" is shorthand for *chile con carne*, which translates to "chile peppers with meat." No beans in sight.

Most people think that chili can trace its origins to Mexico, but it's actually an authentically Texan dish. As the Houston Press explains, "In the 1700s, the government of New Spain recruited Canary Islanders to move to San Antonio. Canary Island women made a tangia-like stew with meat, cumin, garlic, chile peppers, and wild onions that they cooked outdoors in copper kettles in their settlement, La Villita." Their peculiar, chile and cumin-heavy spice blend resembled the Berber seasoning style of Morocco." Another early version of chili was a shelf-stable brick of dried beef, suet, and chiles that could be mixed with water to provide cowboys with sustenance out on the range. Over the years, as chili made its way throughout the rest of the United States, it picked up plenty of additional ingredients, but in Texas, it hasn't changed much from its early days as a Moroccan-style stew.

Head to Texas today and order a "bowl of red" (as the locals call it), and you'll indeed receive something that more closely resembles a simple beef stew than your vision of modern-day chili: tender chunks of beef (usually chuck) in a rich, thick sauce that contains chiles, maybe some additional spices, and not much else. No tomatoes, no beans. It might not be how you picture chili, but a great bowl of Texas red is a thing of beauty.
