With the fall rains about to descend on us, our lagoon is working at its capacity. There are a few things that you can do to help lighten the load on it. One of the best things you can do, is to extend your downspouts. You can purchase extenders from most hardware stores, or online. They simply hook to your downspout and run the water a little further from your house. This waters your yard at the same time as it stops the water from running into your weeping tile and from there into our sewer system.

Another idea is to collect the runoff into rain barrels, then use the healthy rain water to water plants and yards. It's a pretty simple but effective way to help out. Keeping downspouts running further from your house will also help minimize or even eliminate water seepage into your basements. So please give it some thought and see how and what you can do to keep ground water out of our sewer system.




