

Restorative Justice

It's not a new idea. Most people today have heard of Peace Circles and at this point we know that these programs work very well with youth in particular, and not so much with adults. Not unheard of with adults; just the success rates are much lower.

Circles offer an opportunity for those having committed harm to take responsibility for that harm, understand the impact it has had on people and the community at large. They are held to account through understanding and given a chance for reparation and reintegration. They can voice why they did what they did and learn to listen and comprehend the consequence of their behaviours.

For those that have been harmed, such circles are the place to say and show the circle person subject how that harm has damaged the people and community at large and voice the values that are common to all societies for civilized living. The circle bands together in the goal of healthy community to aid the offender into different choices, a way to understand values of society that are contributing and of service to both themselves and the community they live in.

A very short list of such values very commonly found in the world of Peach Circles are: Trust, Honesty, Respect, Humility, Sharing, Empathy, Courage, Inclusiveness, Forgiveness & Love.

As an adult, if one is showing up as unreliable, untrustworthy, not holding the courage to speak truth and not offering empathy in a time to those in such a need, how can you expect the children around you to behave any differently? Why would anyone using grounded thoughts reach out in your direction for help? They wouldn't.

Personally, I see Restorative Justice as a living and breathing phenomena in all communities. People through 'good intentions' do great harm sometimes. The very least one could do in recognition of the harm done is to apologize and commit to not doing that again.

Apologies have 6 steps: 1. Sincerely express regret, 2. Outline what went wrong, 3. Take responsibility/ acknowledge of harm, 4. Declare regret, 5. Offer repair and 6. Ask for forgiveness.

- Physical abuse

The Signs of Domestic Abuse

If a person is in a domestic abuse situation, you might notice changes in their behaviour or physical signs, such as:

- Frequent injuries
- Anxiety or depression
- Low self-esteem
- Fearfulness
- Lack of interest in activities
- Suicidal thoughts
- Withdrawn from family and friends
- Hinting about abuse
- Not making decisions without their partner
- Limited access to money


