Say NO to Raw Dough

What You Need to Know

Don't taste or eat raw (unbaked) dough or batter.

- Don't let children handle raw dough, including play clay and dough for crafts.
- Uncooked flour and raw eggs can contain germs that can make you sick if you taste raw dough.
- Wash your hands, bowls, utensils, and countertops after handling raw flour, eggs, or dough.

Raw Dough Can Contain Germs That Make You Sick

Flour doesn't look like a raw food, but most flour is raw. That means it hasn't been treated to kill germs that cause food poisoning, such as *Escherichia coli* (*E. coli*) and *Salmonella*. These harmful germs can contaminate grain while it's still in the field or flour while it's being made. Steps like grinding grain and bleaching flour don't kill harmful germs—and these germs can end up in flour or baking mixes you buy at the store. You can get sick if you eat unbaked dough or batter made with flour containing germs. Germs are killed only when flour is baked or cooked.

CDC investigated outbreaks linked to raw flour or cake mix in 2016, 2019, 2021, and 2023. Some of these investigations led to recalls. Flour and baking mixes containing flour have long shelf lives, meaning they do not go bad quickly. It's a good idea to check your pantry to see if you have any flour or baking mixes that have been recalled in recent years (search FDA's recall list). Throw away any recalled flour or baking mixes you have.

Raw eggs are another ingredient in dough and batter that can make you or your loved ones sick. Raw and lightly cooked eggs can contain *Salmonella*, a germ that causes food poisoning. Find out how to handle and cook eggs properly.

Good Guys & Bad Guys

There's been quite a bit of chatter of late about the newest various bug/virus that is floating around and what to do or not do about that. Education of self is my suggestion. I think I've put forward this title as a suggestion to our local library as a purchase at one time, and now point people to it as a starting place.

This book was released just BEFORE the whole COVID journey began and was/is (well) somewhat prophetic. A long title & subtitle..."Crisis in the Red Zone - The story of the deadliest Ebola outbreak in history, and the outbreaks to come" by Richard Preston

(until we figured it out) Culturally, eating a tablespoon of honey each morning is standard fair in his culture & home...he'd run out of honey he'd brought with him to Canada, and bought some local organic honey thinking nothing about it, until he became very sick.

So, health for one, can be poison to another, OR, out of context can offer complications. As said...we've created a worldly dust storm of virus/super bugs and it's a roll of the dice of how one thing from that part of the world will land on another. I do nonetheless think we're all giving this reality our best shot and filled with good intentions. Yes, continue worldly travel; just be smart about it. In the bugs and virus's world there are "good guys" too. In context and married up well we have bacteriophages; shorthand, we call them phages. They literally will eat up nasty bacteria from the human body that our variety of anti-biotic drugs won't affect. Thank you, little guys -- so small not seen in regular microscopes. And guess what ? these Phages are actually a virus. Gotta love that, we tiny viruses eating up nasty bacteria leaving the useful bacteria to continue doing its good works. 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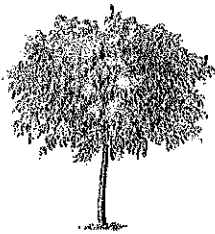
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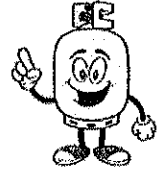

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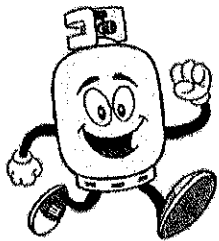
