
FREE LIBRARY MOVIE NIGHT

CAO Report to Council

August 10, 2023

- Read on Roads has been contracted to perform road reconstruction and rehabilitation as per the 2023 budget in the amount of \$165,661.50 plus the cost of gravel.
- Cardston County will provide gravel hauling and grader service to Read on Roads while undertaking the road reconstruction which will begin the last week in August billed at County rates.
- 3. Window Medics has been awarded the contract to install triple pane windows and an insulated door at the Village Office in the amount of \$10,151.31.
- Window Medics has been awarded the contract remove old wood under the eaves on the Community Hall and Install aluminum soffits. Contract amount \$4096.00
- Mario J has been awarded the contract to provide and install vinyl flooring in the Community Hall at a cost of \$8931.00
- Administration is awaiting final pricing on the new well to be drilled this fall. This project will see a new well drilled by Dolman Ltd of Pincher Creek.
- At the wellsite a new shack, cement pad, electronics, plumbing and electrical will provided by Beck Excavating through their sub-trades, as well as the decommissioning of the old well.
- 8. Design work on new bulk water system is still underway.

- Previously purchased EV stations are going to be installed by the Village Office. The bollard installation and underground work has been completed. Whitton Electric is providing the service. This project, started in 2022 will be funded by a grant from Climate Change Alberta.
- 10. The Spray Park has been out of operation and is currently on manual at this time. There are issues with the sensors and the control system currently being investigated by Whitton Electric and the tech support for Play Quest. The electronic control system was originally installed in the wet well, therefore condensation and water issues have caused no end of problems with its operations. Repairs to the buckets and flower sprinklers at the Spray Park have been completed and the Village will see a payment of \$1600.00 from the Insurance company to offset 60% of the costs.
- The repairs of damages from the 2021 hall storm have finally been completed and the file has been closed.

Obituary

Leon Earl Archibald passed away peacefully on Friday, July 7, 2023 at the age of 80 in Lethbridge.

Leon is survived by his current wife Larraine; his children Kelly (Keith) Boehmer and their children Kelcee, Keldon and Russell and his children; Clark Archibald; Cole (Brandy) Archibald and their children Grayson and Hayden; Chris Archibald and his children Tristan and Brooke; Cory (Amanda) Archibald and their children Owen, Aspen and Jace; Cary (Tiffany) Archibald and their children Kylyn (Lorenzo) Keck and their son Carter, Tyler Rosenfeld and Mia Montemayor; his sisters Brenda (Sonny) Ferris; Denese (Malcolm) Poettcker; and his brother Kevin (Rae Ann) Archibald. He is also survived by numerous nieces and nephews and many cousins.

Leon was predeceased by his son, Craig Archibald (1996); his first wife of 49 years, Judy (Tolley) Archibald (2016) and his parents Earl (1990) and May (1999) Archibald.

Leon was born on a cold wintery day; December 6, 1942 in Cardston, He was raised in Glenwood in the family home. He attended his elementary school years in Glenwood and attended high school in Cardston. Leon grew up in Glenwood doing many things boys do; farm chores, playing with many dogs that he had and terrorizing the town as he always had a car and would take his buddies along.

After graduating from high school in Cardston, Leon had jobs working on heavy machinery building the Waterton Dam, drove gravel truck for his father, helped build Highway #3 West and many other laborious jobs.

In 1962-64, he served a mission for the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints in the French East French Speaking Mission in France.

On June 4, 1966 Leon married Judy Tolley in the Cardston LDS Temple. Soon after they both attended Utah State University in Logan, Utah for a few years. He was in the Manufacturing Engineering program but never completed his degree as farming was what he loved the most. So back to the farm he came.

Leon and Judy lived in Pincher Creek for a few years until moving to Fort Macleod in 1974 to begin farming operations. Leon loved his family and continued his dedication to the farming way of life for many years. As farm operations slowed down, he continued to work as a truck driver for B&D Walter Trucking for over ten years. In between farm activities, he loved roaming the mountains and hills in his Bronco, four wheeling with his children, going fishing, going on many family trips to Waterton and just enjoyed being with his grandchildren.

Leon served faithfully in many church callings and served his fellow man. He always gave of his time and talents where needed. He enjoyed everything that Judy made especially apple and lemon pie, always made homemade fudge whenever he could, enjoyed chocolate M&M's and Mentos and a Pepsi to drink and loved playing cribbage or a mean game of Rook.

RCMP Media Release:

The Cardston RCMP along with other RCMP jurisdictions continue to investigate a string of Motor vehicle thefts from Raymond to Pincher Creek. In almost every instance there were two common factors that lead to the victims vehicles being stolen. One was an unlocked exterior home door and two, the keys for vehicles in the driveway being left within 10ft of that door. Our rural life style and small town mentality can make us targets for property crime at times but there are small things that can be done that will greatly deter criminals and make your property less appealing.

- 1. Make a habit of closing gates over cattle guards and driveways, if possible keep them locked or at least keep them locked over night or while your away from home. Same goes for all out buildings and fuel pup tanks.
- 2. Keys; keep all your keys in a secure location away from the main entry to your home, especially if your in the habit of keeping your doors unlocked.
- Property lights in and around your home, outbuildings, fuel tanks and machinery are some of the cheapest property crime deterrents on the market.
- 4. Talk to your neighbours; let them know when you'll be on vacation, let them know about suspicious vehicles or persons in the area and let them know if you've been a victim of property crime or feel the area has been targeted.

We do more to protect our rural life styles and small town routines when we work together to reduce the amount of crime in our area and make the area in general less appealing to the criminal element.





CAO REPORT – SEPTEMBER 14, 2023 PRESENTED TO COUNCIL

- 1. As you are aware the street rehabilitation is in full swing. The project should be completed by Monday, September 18, 2023. Inconveniences to the residents and travelling public are to be expected when heavy equipment and materials are hauled in to do this project. The company performing this work will be working throughout the entire weekend to ensure the materials are laid down during warm weather.
- 2. The well replacement project is slated for sometime in October when the well head pressure is down on the well to be de-commissioned. I have been in close contact with the engineers regarding this project. Costs have increased substantially for this project to a maximum of \$135,000.00. The good news is the road rehabilitation has come in under estimates so all the costs of these projects will be covered by MSI funding from the Alberta Government. Cardston County has generously agreed to fund \$45,000.00 of the cost of the well so we have sufficient funding to cover all costs.
- 3. The bulk water system upgrade design work is done and the project is presently being put out for quotes. This project is slated to go ahead this fall.
- 4. The windows and door for the Administration building are still on back order. The contractor believes they should be shipped this month. As soon as the windows are here, the contractor will install them and complete the soffit upgrade on the Community Hall at the same time.
- 5. The EV stations are installed and have been inspected by Safety Codes. The Village has now ordered the new meter and the stations should be operation this fall. Please be advised that there will be a minimum billing to the Village of at least \$70.00 per month even if the stations are not used. Once the stations are operational, I will apply to Alberta Transportation for the EV charging placard to be placed on the highway signage to inform the travelling public of their existence.

- 6. Mr. Hunsperger will be off work for the month of October, and Cardston Country has graciously agreed to provide water/sewer plant and operations services during that time. A part time replacement employee will be used for the other duties during that time.
- 7. The spray park has been shut down and winterized and Perry will be shutting down the irrigation system the week of September 25.
