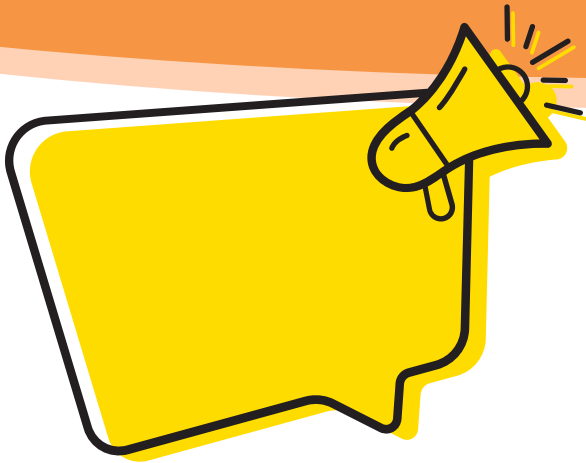

SHELLEY'S AUTUMN GARDEN TIPS

Tip#1

Save those Seeds! Those last overripe peas that are chalky and bitter are valuable. Simply dry them flat in a cool dry space in the dark for a couple weeks. Shell them, store them in a jar in the dark until spring. Soak overnight before planting. You can save seeds from beans, squash, spinach, radish, broccoli and more.* Use heirloom seeds as hybrid and genetically modified seeds often don't breed true.

Tip#2

Autumn Gold. If you're still hauling fall leaves to the dump you are literally throwing away autumn gold. Bag them, crush them then add to compost, use as mulch in your garden, throw a few handfuls in a pot at planting, build new garden beds. As the leaves decompose they feed the micro-the soil that do the heavy lifting, converting the leaves into sugar and minerals that the plants can use. They also mitigate drought by acting as a sponge for water.

Tip#3 Planning new garden beds? Now is a good time as there will soon be an abundance of garden/harvest refuse.

1. Plan your site. Is there enough sun? Does the hose reach that part of the yard? Can your wheelbarrow get by or get access?
 2. Work smarter; not harder. Use the no dig method. Cover space with cardboard topped with a layer of non-treated wood, layers of yard refuse, grass clippings, compost, mulch, manure and or cover crops.
 3. Water, weed, and mulch as needed.
- By spring you can add a bit of potting soil and sow your seeds.

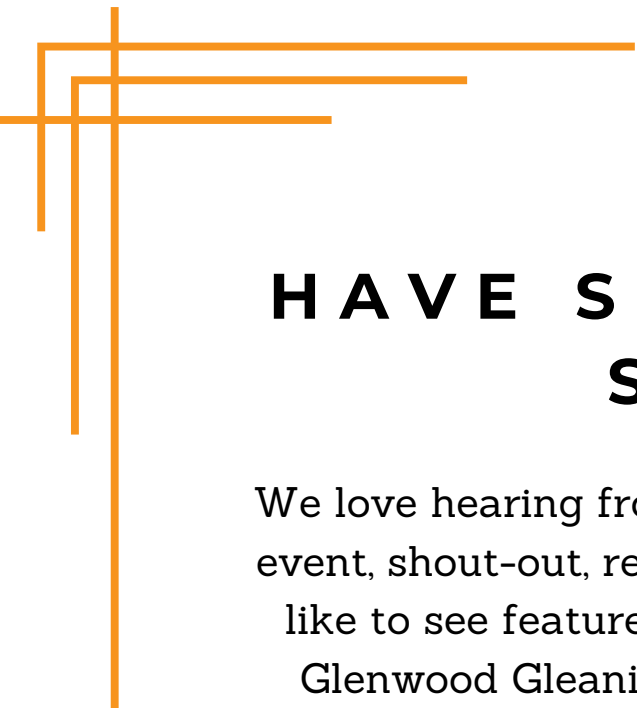
